



DIRECTOR OF MAINTENANCE

We are seeking an experienced Director of Maintenance to join our team working in an active flight school maintenance environment. Compensation for this position is DOE.

Essential Functions:

The Director of Maintenance is responsible for the direct supervision of aircraft maintenance including supervising technicians and working directly on company owned and operated aircraft, and customer aircraft, to achieve the highest level of safety and dispatch.

This is a full-time employee position.

Specific Duties:

- Work with Flight Operations to maintain a culture of safety with efficient procedures that support customer service
- Supervise and perform maintenance on aircraft in accordance to applicable Federal Aviation Regulations
- Plan and assign work following the schedules and work orders
- Coordinate aircraft maintenance, scheduled and unscheduled, for the flight school
- Maintain accurate records, including logbook entries, as required by the Federal Aviation Administration
- Comply with all FAA and Company directives, rules, policies and regulations, including attendance at all standardization, safety and maintenance meetings
- Review and approves maintenance related invoices from vendors
- Maintain inventory, order approved parts, and provide general assistance with all aspects of the shop
- Conduct periodic performance reviews for line mechanics
- Conduct disciplinary counseling, training, and oversight of mechanics
- Adhere to and maintain a consistent schedule of availability to perform duties
- Ensure all Company premises and aircraft are kept neat, clean and free of debris
- Dress in a professional and appropriate manner
- Act in a professional and courteous manner at all times

- Immediately notify management of any maintenance or operational safety concerns
- Performs other duties as assigned

Minimum Qualifications:

- Airframe & Powerplant (A&P) certificate
- 2 years or more of piston-powered and General Aviation experience
- Knowledge and understanding of Federal Aviation regulations and manufacture's manuals
- Subject to alcohol and drug testing program
- FAA Inspection Authorization (IA)
